


Mobile In Mind


- Users may access your site on a variety of different devices, and should be able to find the most important information on your site on all of them.
- Mobile screens can't present information the same way larger screens can.
- The goal of contemporary web design is to create sites which are easy to use on any device in one of two ways:
 - Creating a separate mobile-only site.
 - Building a site using "responsive" design.



Responsive Design

- More white space on larger views
- Fewer "fixed" items like grids and tables
- Detailed content hidden behind links
- Simplified navigation
- Focus on scrolling as opposed to clicking

Navigation Menus

- Top navigation menu will only display folders.
 - We've added "Folder Home" links to each folder.
 - Consider what your menus will look like on full and mobile screens.
 - Minimize navigation options where possible.
- Navigation portlets will be pushed below content.
- Goal: targeted navigation, in as few clicks as possible.
